



Torah Portion Chayei Sarah - Sarah Lived
November 11, 2023 - Chesvan 27, 5784
Genesis 25:19-28:9; Malachi 1:1-2:7; John 4:3-14

***Genesis 23:1-2** Sarah lived one hundred and twenty-seven years; these were the years of the life of Sarah. So Sarah died in Kirjath Arba (that is, Hebron) in the land of Canaan, and Abraham came to mourn for Sarah and to weep for her.

***1 Thessalonians 5:16-18** Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for **this is God's will for you** in Yeshua HaMashiach.

***Genesis 20:2** Abraham said of his wife Sarah, She is my sister. So Abimelech king of Gerar had Sarah brought to him.

***Genesis 16:7-8** I will establish My covenant as an everlasting covenant between Me and you and your descendants after you, to be your God and the God of your descendants after you. And to **you and your descendants I will give the land where you are residing—all the land of Canaan—as an eternal possession; and I will be their God.**

***Genesis 12:7** On that day the Lord made a covenant with Abram and said, "To your descendants I give this land, from the Wadi of Egypt to the great river, the Euphrates - the land of the Kenites, Kenizzites, Kadmonites, Hittites, Perizzites, Rephaites, Amorites, Canaanites, Girgashites and Jebusites.

***Revelation 2:14-15** But I have a few things against you, because you have there those who hold the doctrine of Balaam, who taught Balak to put a **stumbling block before the children of Israel, to eat things sacrificed to idols,** and to commit **sexual immorality.** Thus you also have those who hold the **doctrine of the Nicolaitans, which thing I hate.**

***Genesis 23:2** So Sarah died in Kirjathh Arba (that is, Hebron) in the land of Canaan, and Abraham came to mourn for Sarah and to weep for her.

***Zechariah 12:10-11a,12a** And I will pour on the house of David and on the inhabitants of Jerusalem the Spirit of grace and supplication; then they will look on Me whom they pierced. Yes, **they will mourn** for Him **as one mourns** for his only son, and grieve for Him as one grieves for a firstborn. ¹¹ In that day there shall be a **great mourning** in Jerusalem.....and **the land shall mourn**.....

***Genesis 23:3** Abraham rose up from upon the face of his dead and spoke to the Sons of Heth; saying: An alien and a resident am I among you; grant me legal possession of land for a burial site, with you, then I will bury my dead from before me.

***Genesis 23:5** And the Sons of Heth answered Abraham, saying to him: Hear us, my lord: a prince of God are you in our midst; in the choicest of our burial places bury your dead, each man of us his burial place will not withhold from you from burying your dead.

***Genesis 23:7-9** Then Abraham stood up and bowed himself to the people of the land, the sons of Heth. And he spoke with them, saying, If it is your wish that I bury my dead out of my sight, hear me, and meet with Ephron the son of Zohar for me, that he may give me the cave of Machpelah which he has, which is at the end of his field. Let him give it to me at the full price, as property for a burial place among you.

***Genesis 23:14-16** And Ephron answered Abraham, saying to him, My lord, listen to me; the land is worth four hundred shekels of silver. What is that between you and me? So bury your dead. And Abraham listened to Ephron; and Abraham weighed out the silver for Ephron which he had named in the hearing of the sons of Heth, four hundred shekels of silver, currency of the merchants.

***Genesis 23: 19-20** And after this, Abraham buried Sarah his wife in the cave of the field of Machpelah, before Mamre (that is, Hebron) in the land of Canaan. So the field and the cave that is in it were deeded to Abraham by the sons of Heth as property for a burial place.

***Genesis 33:18-20** After Jacob had arrived safely from Paddan-aram, he entered the city of Shechem, which was located in the territory of Canaan, and encamped facing that city. Then he bought a parcel of land for 100 pieces of silver from the descendants of Hamor, Shechem's father. He pitched his tent there, set up an altar, and named it El-Elohe-Israel.

2 Samuel 18:20-21;24 When Araunah looked down, he saw the king and his staff approaching him. Araunah went out, bowed down before the king with his face on the ground, and asked him, Why has your majesty the king come to his servant? David replied, To purchase your threshing floor and to build an altar to the Lord, so the pestilence can be averted from the people. No!" the king replied to Araunah. I will buy them from you at full price. I won't offer to the Lord my God burnt offerings that cost me nothing. So David bought the threshing floor and the oxen for 50 silver shekels, ...

***Joshua 24:8a,c;12a;13a ;14** And I brought you into the land of the Amorites,.....I destroyed them before you;....I sent the hornet before you which drove them out from before you.....I have given you a land for which you did not labor.....cities, vineyards, olive

grove which you did not plant. Now therefore fear the LORD ; Serve Him in sincerity and truth.

***Leviticus 25:23** The land must not be sold permanently, because it is Mine, and you are but foreigners and residents with Me.

***2 Timothy 4:3** For the time will come when men will not tolerate sound doctrine, but with itching ears they will gather around themselves teachers to suit their own desires.

***1 Timothy 4:1** But the Spirit explicitly says that in later times some will fall away from the faith, paying attention to deceitful spirits and doctrines of demons,.....

***Matthew 24:4-5** And Jesus answered and said to them: Take heed that no one deceives you. For many will come in My name, saying, I am the Christ, and will deceive many.

***Isaiah 66:8** Who ever heard of such a thing or imagined it could happen? Can a nation be born in a day or come to life in a second? Jerusalem is like a mother who gave birth to her children as soon as she was in labor.

***Genesis 24:7b** To your descendants I give this land.....

***REVELATION 5:1-7** _Then I saw a scroll in the right hand of the one who was sitting on the throne. There was writing on the inside and the outside of the scroll, and it was sealed with seven seals. And I saw a strong angel, who shouted with a loud voice: "Who is worthy to break the seals on this scroll and open it?" But no one in heaven or on earth or under the earth was able to open the scroll and read it.

Then I began to weep bitterly because no one was found worthy to open the scroll and read it. But one of the twenty-four elders said to me, "Stop weeping! Look, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the heir to David's throne, has won the victory. He is worthy to open the scroll and its seven seals."

Then I saw a Lamb that looked as if it had been slaughtered, but it was now standing between the throne and the four living beings and among the twenty-four elders. He had seven horns and seven eyes, which represent the sevenfold Spirit of God that is sent out into every part of the earth. He stepped forward and took the scroll from the right hand of the one sitting on the throne.

***Genesis 24:1-4** Now Abraham was old, well advanced in age; and the Lord had blessed Abraham in all things. So Abraham said to the oldest servant of his house, who ruled over all that he had, Please, put your hand under my thigh, and I will make you swear by the Lord, the God of heaven and the God of the earth, that you will not take a wife for

my son from the daughters of the Canaanites, among whom I dwell; but you shall go to my country and to my family, and take a wife for my son Isaac.

***John 15:26** I will send you the Helper from the Father. The Helper is the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father. When he comes, he will tell about me.

***Genesis 9:25** And he said, Cursed be Canaan; a servant of servants shall he be unto his brethren. And he said, Blessed be the Lord God of Shem; and Canaan shall be his servant.

***Genesis 24:10** Then the servant took ten of his master's camels and departed, for all his master's goods were in his hand and he arose and went to Mesopotamia to the city of Nahor.

***Proverbs 6:23** * For the mitzvah is a lamp, Torah is light, and reproofs that discipline are the way to life.

***Exodus 27:20** Command the Israelites to bring you clear olive oil, crushed for the light, so that the lamp may always burn.

I Corinthians 12:7-11 The Holy Spirit is given to each of us in a special way. That is for the good of all. ⁸ To some people the Spirit gives a message of wisdom. To others the same Spirit gives a message of knowledge. ⁹ To others the same Spirit gives faith. To others that one Spirit gives gifts of healing. ¹⁰ To others he gives the power to do miracles. To others he gives the ability to prophesy. To others he gives the ability to tell the spirits apart. To others he gives the ability to speak in different kinds of languages they had not known before. And to still others he gives the ability to explain what was said in those languages. ¹¹ All the gifts are produced by one and the same Spirit. He gives gifts to each person, just as he decides.

***Isaiah 53:4** Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; Yet we esteemed Him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted .

***Romans 8:25** In the same way, the Spirit too comes to the aid of our weakness;

***Genesis 24:11,14-15** And he made his camels kneel down outside the city by a well of water at evening, the time when women go out to draw water. THEN HE PRAYED Now let it be that the young woman to whom I say, Please let down your pitcher that I may drink, and she says, 'Drink, and I will also give your camels a drink—*let her be the one* You have appointed for Your servant Isaac. And by this I will know that You have shown kindness to my master.

15 And it happened, before he had finished speaking, that behold, Rebekah, who was born to Bethuel, son of Milcah, the wife of Nahor, Abraham's brother, came out with her pitcher on her shoulder.

***Genesis 2:18** she hurried;

2:19 she drew water; and she gave drink

2:20 she hurried and she drew water

***Genesis 24:23-26;28** Tell me, please, is there room in your father's house for us to lodge? So she said to him, I am the daughter of Bethuel, Milcah's son, whom she bore to Nahor. Moreover, she said to him, We have both straw and feed enough, and room to lodge. Then the man bowed down his head and worshiped the Lord....So the young woman ran and told her mother's household these things.

***Genesis 24:29-31** Now Rebekah had a brother whose name was Laban, and Laban ran out to the man by the well. So it came to pass, when he saw the nose ring, and the bracelets on his sister's wrists, and when he heard the words of his sister Rebekah, saying, Thus the man spoke to me," that he went to the man. And there he stood by the camels at the well. ³¹ And he said, Come in, O blessed of the Lord! Why do you stand outside? For I have prepared the house, and a place for the camels.

***Genesis 24:49,50,55-58**-Now if you will deal kindly and truly with my master, tell me. And if not, tell me, that I may turn to the right hand or to the left.

Then Laban and Bethuel answered and said, The thing comes from the Lord; we cannot speak to you either bad or good. Here is Rebekah before you; take her and go, and let her be your master's son's wife, as the Lord has spoken. But her brother and her mother said, Let the young woman stay with us a few days, at least ten; after that she may go. And he said to them, Do not hinder me, since the Lord has prospered my way; send me away so that I may go to my master. So they said, We will call the young woman and ask her personally. Then they called Rebekah and said to her, Will you go with this man?"

And she said, "I will go.

***Romans 10:9** If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.

***Genesis 24:61b-** So the servant took Rebekah and departed. Now Isaac came from the way of Beer Lahai Roi, for he dwelt in the South. And Isaac went out to meditate in the field in the evening; and he lifted his eyes and looked, and there, the camels *were* coming. Then Rebekah lifted her eyes, and when she saw Isaac she dismounted from her camel; for she had said to the servant, *Who is this man walking in the field to meet us?*

The servant said, *It is my master.* **So she took a veil and covered herself.** And the servant told Isaac all the things that he had done. Then **Isaac brought her into his mother Sarah's tent; and he took Rebekah and she became his wife, and he loved her.** So Isaac was **comforted after his mother's death.**
