



*Torah Portion Toldot - Esau and Hamas*  
*November 18, 2023. Kislev 5, 5784*  
*Genesis 25:19-28:9; Malachi 1:1-2:7; Matthew 10:21-38*

**\*Ruth 4:18** Now these are the **generations** תורתי **of Perez**

**\*Luke 1:31&35** Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Yeshua. .... The angel answered, The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the Holy One to be born will be called the Son of God.

**\*Hebrews 11:17-18** By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was in the act of **offering up his only son**, of whom it was said, Through Isaac shall your offspring be named.

**\*I John 4:9** In this the love of God was manifested toward us, that God has sent **His only betotten Son** into the world, that we might live through Him.

**\*Matthew 12:40** For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of a huge fish, so the Son of Man will be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth.

**\*Genesis 25:19-20** This is the genealogy of Isaac, Abraham's son. Abraham begot Isaac. Isaac was forty years old when he took Rebekah as wife, the daughter of Bethuel the Syrian of Padan Aram, the sister of Laban the Syrian.

**\*Galatians 5:1** It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery.

**\*2 Corinthians 3:17** Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom.

**\*Genesis 25:20** Now **Isaac pleaded with the LORD for his wife**, because **she was barren**; and the **LORD granted his plea**, and **Rebekah his wife conceived**.

**\*Genesis 25:22** But the **children struggled together within her**; and she said, If all is well, why am I like this? So she went to inquire of the LORD.

**\*Genesis 25:23-24** And the Lord said to her: Two nations are in your womb, two peoples shall be separated from your body; one people shall be stronger than the other, and the older shall serve the younger. So when her days were fulfilled for her to give birth, indeed there were twins in her womb. And the first came out red. He was like a hairy garment all over; so they called his name Esau. Afterward his brother came out, and his hand took hold of Esau's heel; so his name was called Jacob. Isaac was sixty years old when she bore them.

**\*Genesis 25:29-34** Once when Jacob was cooking some stew, Esau came in from the open country, famished.

He said to Jacob, Quick, let me have some of that red stew! I'm famished! (That is why he was also called Edom. )

Jacob replied, First sell me your birthright. Look, I am about to die, Esau said. What good is the birthright to me? But Jacob said, Swear to me first. So he swore an oath to him, selling his birthright to Jacob.

Then Jacob gave Esau some bread and some lentil stew. He ate and drank, and then got up and left. So Esau despised his birthright.

**\*Hebrews 12:14-17** Pursue peace with all *people*, and holiness, without which no one will see the Lord: looking carefully lest anyone fall short of the grace of God; lest any root of bitterness springing up cause trouble, and by this many become defiled; lest there be any fornicator or profane person like Esau, who for one morsel of food sold his birthright. For you know that afterward, when he wanted to inherit the blessing, he was rejected, for he found no place for repentance, though he sought it diligently with tears.

**\*Genesis 26:2** Then the LORD appeared to him (Isaac) and said: Do not go down to Egypt; live in the land of which I shall tell you.

**\*Genesis 26:12&14a, 15** Then Isaac sowed in that land, and reaped in the same year a hundredfold; and the Lord blessed him. For he had possessions of flocks and possessions of herds and a great number of servants. So the Philistines envied him. For all the wells which his father's servants had dug in the days of Abraham his father, the Philistines had stopped them, and filled them with earth. And Abimelech said unto Isaac, Go from us; for you are much mightier than we.

**\*Genesis 26:16-18** And Isaac dug anew the of water which they had dug in the days of Abraham his father and the Philistines had stopped up after Abraham's death; and he called them by the same names that his father had called them.

**\*Genesis 26:20** The herdsmen of Gerar quarreled with Isaac's herdsmen, saying, "The water is ours." So he called the name of the well Esek, because they contended with him.

**\*Genesis 26:21** Then they dug another well, and they quarreled over that one also. So he called its name Sitnah.

**\*Genesis 26:22,24b** And he moved from there and dug another well, and they did not quarrel over it. So he called its name Rehoboth, because he said, For now the LORD has made room for us, and we shall be fruitful in the land. .... And the LORD appeared to him the same night.

**\*Isaiah 12:3** Joyfully shall you draw water from the fountains of salvation. BUT THE LORD SAYS:

**\*Jeremiah 2:13** For My people have committed two evils; They have forsaken Me, the fountain of living waters, and hewn themselves cisterns - broken cisterns that can hold no water.

**\*John 4:5-14** So He came to a city of Samaria which is called Sychar, near the plot of ground that Jacob gave to his son Joseph. Now Jacob's well was there. Yeshua therefore, being wearied from *His* journey, sat thus by the well. It was about the sixth hour. A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give Me a drink." For His disciples had gone away into the city to buy food. Then the woman of Samaria said to Him, "How is it that You, being a Jew, ask a drink from me, a Samaritan woman?" For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans. Yeshua answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is who says to you, 'Give Me a drink,' you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water." The woman said to Him, "Sir, You have nothing to draw with, and the well is deep. Where then do You get that living water? Are You greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well, and drank from it himself, as well as his sons and his livestock?" Yeshua answered and said to her, "Whoever drinks of this water will thirst again, but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life."

**\*Genesis 26:34-35** When Esau was forty years old, he took as wives Judith the daughter of Beerli the Hittite, and Basemath the daughter of Elon the Hittite. And they were a grief of mind to Isaac and Rebekah.

**\*Genesis 25:28** And Isaac loved Esau because he ate of his game, but Rebekah loved Jacob.

**\*Genesis 27:1-3;4b** Now it came to pass, when Isaac was old and his eyes were so dim that he could not see, that he called Esau his older son and said to him, "My son." And he answered him, "Here I am." Then he said, "Behold now, I am old. I do not know the day of my death. Now therefore, please take your weapons, your quiver and your bow, and go out to the field and hunt game for me.....that my soul may bless you before I die.

**\*Genesis 27:10** Then you shall take it to your father that he may eat it and that he may bless you.

**\*Genesis 27:41** So Esau hated Jacob because of the blessing with which his father blessed him, and Esau said in his heart, The days of mourning for my father are at hand; then I will kill my brother Jacob.

**\*Genesis 25:30** And Esau said to Jacob, Feed me, I pray thee, with that same red pottage; for I am faint: therefore was his name called Edom. AND ISAAC SAID TO ESAU:

**\*Genesis 27:40** By your sword you shall live and serve your brother.

**\*Amos 1:11** This is what the LORD says: For three sins of Edom, even for four, I will not relent. Because he pursued his brother with a sword and slaughtered the women of the land, because his anger raged continually and his fury flamed unchecked,

**\*Genesis 36:12** Additionally, Timna, a concubine of Esau's son Eliphaz, gave birth to Amalek. These are the grandsons of Esau's wife Adah.

**\*Exodus 17:16b** The LORD will have war with Amalek from generation to generation.

**\*Numbers 20:18-21** But Edom answered: You may not pass through here; if you try, we will march out and attack you with the sword. The Israelites replied: We will go along the main road, and if we or our livestock drink any of your water, we will pay for it. We only want to pass through on foot—nothing else. Again they answered: "You may not pass through." Then Edom came out against them with a large and powerful army. Since Edom refused to let them go through their territory, Israel turned away from them.

**\*Genesis 32:3** Jacob sent messengers ahead of him to his brother Esau in the land of Seir, the country of Edom.

**\*Genesis 36:8** So Esau (that is, Edom) settled in the hill country of Seir.

**\*Zechariah 1:8** I saw in the night, and behold a man riding upon a red horse, and he stood among the myrtle trees in the glen; and behind him were red, sorrel, and white horses.

**\*Revelation 6:4** Another horse, firey red went out. And it was granted to the one who sat on it to take peace from the earth and that people should kill one another; and there was given to him a great sword.

**\*Genesis 25:25** And the first came out red, all over like a hairy garment; and they called his name Esau.

**\*Genesis 25:30** And Esau said to Jacob, Feed me, I beg you with that same red pottage; for I am famished; therefore, was his name called Edom.

**\*Genesis 27:40** And by your sword shall you live and shall serve your brother....

**\*Genesis 27:41** Now Esau hated Jacob because of the blessing with which his father had blessed him, and Esau said to himself, The days of mourning for my father are approaching; then I will kill my brother Jacob.

**\*Ecclesiastes 1:9** What has been will be again what has been done will be done again; there is nothing new under the sun.

**\*Genesis 3:15** And I will put enmity Between you and the woman, And between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, And you shall bruise His heel.

**\*Isaiah 17:12-14** Woe to the many nations that rage—they rage like the raging sea! Woe to the peoples who roar—they roar like the roaring of great waters! Although the peoples roar like the roar of surging waters, when he rebukes them they flee far away, driven before the wind like chaff on the hills, like tumbleweed before a gale. In the evening, sudden terror! Before the morning, they are gone. This is the portion of those who loot us the lot of those who plunder us.

**\*Psalm 137:7** Remember, LORD, what the Edomites did on the day Jerusalem fell. Tear it down, they cried, tear it down to its foundations!

**\*Ezekiel 38:7** Get ready; be prepared! Keep all the armies around you mobilized, and take command of them.

**\*Daniel 10:13** But the prince of the kingdom of Persia withstood me twenty-one days; and behold, Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me, for I had been left alone there with the kings of Persia.

**\*Isaiah 24:22** They will be gathered together as prisoners in a pit; they will be shut up in a prison, and after many days they will be punished.

**\*Amos 1:11** This is what the LORD says: For three transgressions of Edom, even four, I will not revoke My judgment, because he pursued his brother with the sword and stifled all compassion; his anger raged continually, and his fury flamed incessantly.

**\*Proverbs 27:20** Hell and Destruction are never full.....

**\*Ezekiel 7:10-12** Behold, the day! Behold, it has come! Doom has gone out; The rod has blossomed, Pride has budded. Violence has risen up into a rod of wickedness; None of them shall remain, None of their multitude, None of them; Nor shall there be wailing for them.

**\*Nahum 1:9** What do you conspire against the LORD? He will make an utter end of it. Affliction will not rise up a second time.

**\*Ezekiel 7:7** It has come! Doom has come upon you--you who dwell in the land. The time has come, the day is near; there is panic, not joy, upon the mountains.

**\*Ezekiel 35:15** Because you rejoiced when the inheritance of Israel became desolate, that is how I will treat you. You will be desolate, Mount Seir, you and all of Edom. Then they will know that I am the LORD.

**\*Isaiah 6:1** Who is this coming from Edom, from Bozrah, with his garments stained crimson? Who is this, robed in splendor, striding forward in the greatness of his strength? "It is I, proclaiming victory, mighty to save."

**\*Isaiah 34:5-6** My sword has drunk its fill in the heavens; see, it descends in judgment on Edom, the people I have totally destroyed. The sword of the LORD is bathed in blood, it is covered with fat— the blood of lambs and goats, fat from the kidneys of rams. For the LORD has a sacrifice in Bozrah and a great slaughter in the land of Edom.
